Over five million workers in health care related fields are at risk to exposure to blood borne pathogens, such as the HIV virus and hepatitis B virus, as well as tuberculosis. If you are at risk for exposure, you need to know how to protect yourself. This course is designed to meet the current OSHA training requirements.
