COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course covers basic theories, vocabulary, principles, techniques, media and problem-solving in basic design.

COURSE COMPETENCIES

Upon successful completion of this course, a student should be competent to perform the following tasks:

Module 1: History and Terminology

- Discuss the history, function, and development of graphic design and communication.
- Identify specific designers and describe their contributions to the graphic design movement.
- Define the basic method for idea development and planning for design.
- Demonstrate several ways to use elements and principles of design in a project.

Modules 2: Principles and Elements of Design

- Identify the components of a graphic design solution.
- Create a design brief to aid in the creative process.
- Describe how signs, symbols, perspectives, and symmetries are constructed.
- Create design layouts using the formal elements line, shape, color, and texture.
- Explain how color elicits specific psychological responses from the audience.

Module 3: Typography, Layout, and Logos

- Choose fonts, font sizes, and proper hierarchy to create an effective layout.
- Demonstrate the use of words and images to create a strong message.
- Create and use illustrations, graphic illustrations, and photography in an ad layout.
- Discuss different types of logos and how each can be used for appropriate branding.
- Discuss methods which may be used to effectively represent a client's business.
- Describe how fonts, color, shape, and size convey different messages within a logo.
