COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course includes a detailed study of testacy and intestacy, preparation of wills and codicils, and fundamentals of trust and probate administration.

COURSE COMPETENCIES

Upon successful completion of this course, the student should be competent to complete the following tasks:

Module 1 – Planning an Estate

- Define the core terminology related to probate law
- Discuss the effects of an individual passing with a will and passing without a will
- Explain the legal aspects of dying testate vs. intestate

Module 2 – Wills

- Explain the legal requirements for making a will
- Outline the written structure of a will
- Describe, in detail, the legal rights of the testator, family members and others relating to wills
- Draft a will

Module 3 – Trusts

- Define the core terminology related to law of trusts
- Outline the components of a trust
- Draft certain trust documents

Module 4 – Estate Administration

- Outline the process to probate a will
- Identify the courts, individuals, and others involved in the probate process
- Explain the basic tax considerations relating to an estate
